

INDUSTRY ADVISORY BOARD MEMBERSHIP LEVELS, BENEFITS AND FEES

CBE staff and faculty worked with industry member leadership in fall 2009 to update the schedule of membership levels, benefits and fees. The goal of this revision was to create membership tiers for small businesses, to provide equity among partners, to match benefits to membership levels, and to acknowledge the financial constraints of small firms and startups.

In developing the new fee schedule, we consulted the USGBC *Dues Guidelines*, and the U.S. Small Business Administration *Table of Small Business Size Standards Matched to North American Industry Classification System Codes*. The new structure CBE's Executive Board discussed and approved this schedule on October 22, 2009. (Updated 3/10/2010)
